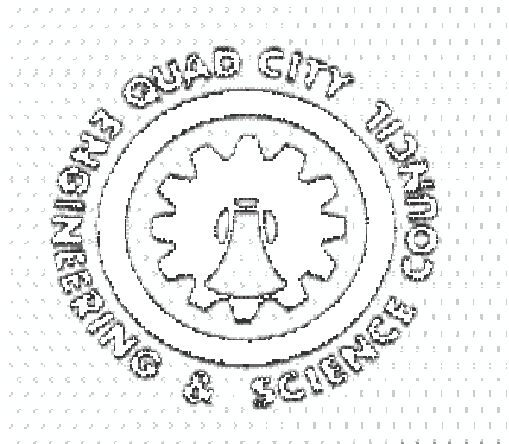

The membership of the Quad-City Engineering and Science Council (QCESC) consists of thirty-one Societies representing about 6,000 members. The QCESC is a non-profit corporation. New society memberships are actively sought as well as relationships with community and business organizations.

PURPOSE

The Engineering Community has committed itself to the service of the public through the intelligent and practical application of engineering and science to meet human needs. To accomplish this commitment, the QCESC embraces a majority of the major technical societies in the Quad-Cities and works to encourage synergistic benefits through a single umbrella organization. The QCESC offers the following advantages to its members/corporate sponsors:

Communication - The QCESC annually publishes a directory listing all member Societies and officers. Officers' phone and fax numbers, chapter mailing addresses, and email addresses are included to encourage inter-society, intra-society, industrial, educational, and government communication.

Home Page - World Wide Web - The QCESC has a home page on the World Wide Web at <http://www.qcesc.org>. This provides a method for communicating information about the QCESC and its member societies. It includes a calendar of upcoming technical events. The addition of home pages for each member society is planned.

Technical - The QCESC offers the ability to sponsor outstanding technical sessions and aid in joint sponsorship, coordination, and development of a reservoir of talented speakers.

Social - A further challenge is to encourage social interaction between societies and the public. The Council annually sponsors a Presidents' Reception in October to promote communications between societies and QCESC. The Council also sponsors the Annual Engineer's Week Banquet in February with attendance open to member societies and the public.

Community - The Council gives support, advice, and/or sponsorship for engineering/science scholarships, Junior and Senior Engineer/ Scientist-of-the-Year Awards, Mathcounts, the US First Robotics, Future City, and Invent Iowa competitions, and career fairs. These events not only serve to encourage and reward top performance by engineers and scientists, but also improve the image of engineering and science at local and national levels.

National Engineers Week Banquet - For the last 40 years, the Council has organized and sponsored a banquet during National Engineers' Week. This banquet brings the Quad-Cities engineering and science communities together for one major celebration of National Engineers Week. As a part of the banquet, the Junior and Senior Engineer/ Scientist-of-the-Year Awards are presented along with scholarships to local high school students showing an interest in engineering or science. In 2005, the Engineers' Week Banquet is scheduled for February 25.

HISTORY OF QCESC

The Quad-City Engineering and Science Council got its start in 1963. Several program chairmen from various societies met in 1962 to discuss a joint meeting to celebrate National Engineers' Week sponsored by the National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE).

A committee was formed, consisting of representatives from ASME, NSPE, SAME, SME, and others. The committee's intention was to focus the public's attention on the importance of the contributions that the engineering and science communities make to society. Billboards were purchased and TV and radio shows interviewed prominent engineers from the Quad-Cities. A press party was held and the first Quad-City Engineers' Week Banquet took place in 1963 at the Masonic Temple. Attendees included the Governors of Iowa and Illinois, state legislators, five mayors, and members of thirteen technical societies, resulting in a total of one thousand people. The Engineers' Week Banquet became an annual event in the Quad-Cities and the Joint Engineers' Council became a reality as its sponsor.

In 1981, the Joint Engineers' Council became incorporated as a non-profit organization called the Quad-City Engineering and Science Council.

In a study published several years ago, the National Academy of Engineering estimated that the “half-life” of an engineer’s skills is 2.5 years in software engineering, 5 years in electrical engineering, and 7.5 years in mechanical engineering.
